

Regulations for Credits Exemption of Department of English, NCCU

Article 1. These regulations are formulated by Article 15 of the "National Chengchi University Regulations".

Article 2. The credit exemption in this regulation is limited to the language courses offered by the Department of English as follows:

- (1) English Oral Training (I): Oral Training and Listening
- (2) English Oral Training (II): Oral Training and Reading
- (3) English Oral Training (III): Oral Training and Reading
- (4) Writing and Reading (I)
- (5) Writing and Reading (II)

Starting from the 113th academic year, the exempted courses are limited to the following:

- (1) English Oral Training (I): Oral Training and Listening
- (2) English Oral Training (II): Oral Training and Reading
- (3) English Oral Training (III): Oral Training and Reading
- (4) Writing and Reading (I)
- (5) Writing and Reading (II)
- (6) Writing and Reading (III)

Article 3. The Credit Exemption Exams are held in the Fall semester. Applications must be submitted to the Department of English office in the week before the school starts. Applications after the deadline will not be accepted.

The deposit of NTD \$500 for each subject must be paid while applying for the Credit Exemption Exams. The deposit will be refunded after the exam. Those who are absent from the exam will not be refunded.

Article 4. After the students pass the credit exemption exam and are reviewed by the department chair, the Department of English office will inform the Registration Section of Office of Academic Affairs of the passing list, which will serve as the basis for exemption from taking the course.

Article 5. Those who pass the credit exemption exams should still take other elective courses offered by the Department of English to make up for their total graduation credits.

Article 6. These regulations will be implemented after being adopted by the Department General Faculty Committee and submitted to the Academic Affairs Office for review. The same applies to revisions.
